## Before the trip

- ☐ Plan "snack", exercise and rest stops about every 2 hours if you're taking a long drive.
- Bring along plenty of water too toys and bowls, of course!
- Pack medication your pet takes regularly. And don't forget the First Aid Kit.
- If staying at hotels, motels or campgrounds, be sure to check pets are welcome.
- If your pet is not used to car rides, take them on short trips before your holiday.
- Be sure your contact details are on their collar ID is up to date.

## **During the trip**

- ☐ It is not recommended to leave pets in the car. Remember, on hot days the temperature in a parked car can rise to dangerous temperature levels in just minutes!
- Be sure your pet is safe by having a seatbelt in the car, or keep them in their crate during the trip.
- Give your pet their main meal at the end of the day, to avoid messy situations
- Give them interactive toys that will distract them and keep them occupied.

## WHERE EVER YOU GO

- Ensure your pet ALWAYS wears a collar with ID with up to date contact details.
- ☐ Have your pet examined and vaccinated, and protected against TICKS and HEARTWORM that might tag along the ride!
